
#### What is AT Reuse?

Assistive technology (AT) is any object, device or tool used to make life easier. AT reuse is the process of taking in used equipment, cleaning and sanitizing it, (some programs even repair) and then providing it to a new owner for little or no cost.

### What are AT Reuse Centers?

Reuse centers are places that accept donations of gently used medical equipment or other AT devices. Centers are responsible for cleaning and/or repairing devices before giving them away or selling them at low-cost to people with disabilities.



## What are the benefits of AT Reuse?

- Provides free or low-cost gently used equipment for people with disabilities that need it, such as when insurance doesn't cover it or if someone doesn't have any insurance.
- Provides equipment to those who need it on a short-term basis, such as when someone is injured.
- Saves money, resources and helps the environment by reusing good equipment.

## What Equipment Can Be Reused?

- Durable medical equipment such as wheelchairs, scooters, shower chairs, patient lifts, hospital beds and walkers
- Low-tech AT, such as magnifiers and reachers
- High-tech AT, including digital devices, computers and augmentative & alternative communication (AAC) devices.
